

Kiln Lane and Westfield Road

Kiln Lane was developed during the 1880s and 1890s, and Westfield Road was developed during the early part of the twentieth century. Most of the properties are wholly, or largely, made from local bricks, and probably built by Cullum's. However, it is interesting to see the combination of brick and stone as used in 1 Kiln Lane, 6 and 11 Westfield Road.

1 Kiln Lane

Mr and Mrs Joseph and Mary Brandum lived here in the 1920s with their children Raymond, Eva and Elsie. Raymond was the Head Teacher at Charlbury School. He never married. Eva was a nurse in London, and Elsie worked as an assistant in Woolworth's in Oxford until she married Stan Woolford, who was a porter at Wheatley Station at the same time as Mr Goodlake.

3 Kiln Lane

Mr and Mrs Arthur Smith lived here with their daughter, Phyllis, who was born here. Arthur was a stonemason, and his father, Fred, helped to build the Church spire. Phyllis was the organist of St Mary's church for many years, and she continued to live in the family home after her marriage, to Richard (Dick) Cox, from Holton, until she died in 1998.

5 Kiln Lane

Mr and Mrs Belsen lived here. They helped the Alien's with their milk-round. Later, Catherine Allen (Mrs Barker) lived here with her two sons, John and Tim. When her husband died she married Paddy Burrige.

7 Kiln Lane

Mr and Mrs Good lake lived here until he built another house on 'The Green'.

9 Kiln Lane

Mr and Mrs Joe Allen lived here. They were related to 'Milky' Allen and they also helped with the milk round.

11 Kiln Lane

This older stone cottage has been extensively enlarged and now faces south: it is integrated with the Old House property.
