
Cullum's Yard

William Cullum (1797-1865) moved to Wheatley from Long Hanborough and established his business in 1843. In 1852 his premises are recorded as a wheelwrights shop and saw pit' in Church Road, somewhere near Pound Cottage. His son, William, was also a wheelwright and grandsons, Francis William and Arthur Edmund, followed in their footsteps. They moved the business to Station Road, now known as Hathaways, but then called Cullum's Yard. There was a wheelwright's shop and a forge with the saw pit and timber yard on the site opposite, which is now Simons Close.



Hathaways appears to have been the name of the forge within the site of Cullum builders.
