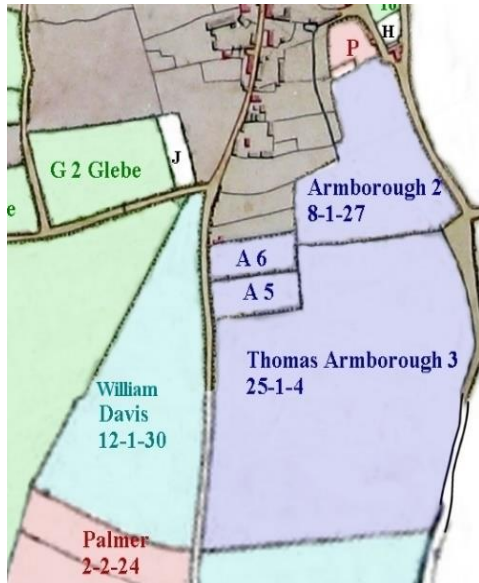

1841	Census 1841	Elizabeth Armborough (wife of John??) aged 70	
1843	Sale see below	Thomas Wace	Joseph Cooper (info from 1845 Poor Rate survey)
1850		Rev Richard Henry Wace (bequeathed by uncle Thomas Wace)	
1894	Sale for £1355	William Boughton (d. 1920) of 5 Broadway, Hammersmith	Tenant Charles Shepherd, both names confirmed by 1910 Valuation Survey, which shows that it farmed 37 acres
1922	Sale for £1900	Charles Shepherd	He also bought a large area of land which had been part of Crown Farm, owned by the late A W Hall.
1927	Sale	Magdalen College	All land other than part to Gibbard, presumably the house, and the frontage to Crown Road on which he built 4 pairs of detached houses, one each for his four sons.
1927	Sale	Edward Gibbard	He was a horse dealer and had a butcher's shop in Oxford market, see text below Figure 2
1945	Sale	Bullington RDC	8-0-32 acres
1949	Sale	May Jefferies	The Gibbard holding less the Bullington RDC sale
1950	Sale	John Ernest Freeborne	Butcher, who also had a shop
1955	Sale	Fred and Moira Anson	Plots 119 and part 53
1955	Part sale	Marjorie Baylis	Bought house in 1964
1960	Sale	Builder of Anson Close	Plots 119 and part 53

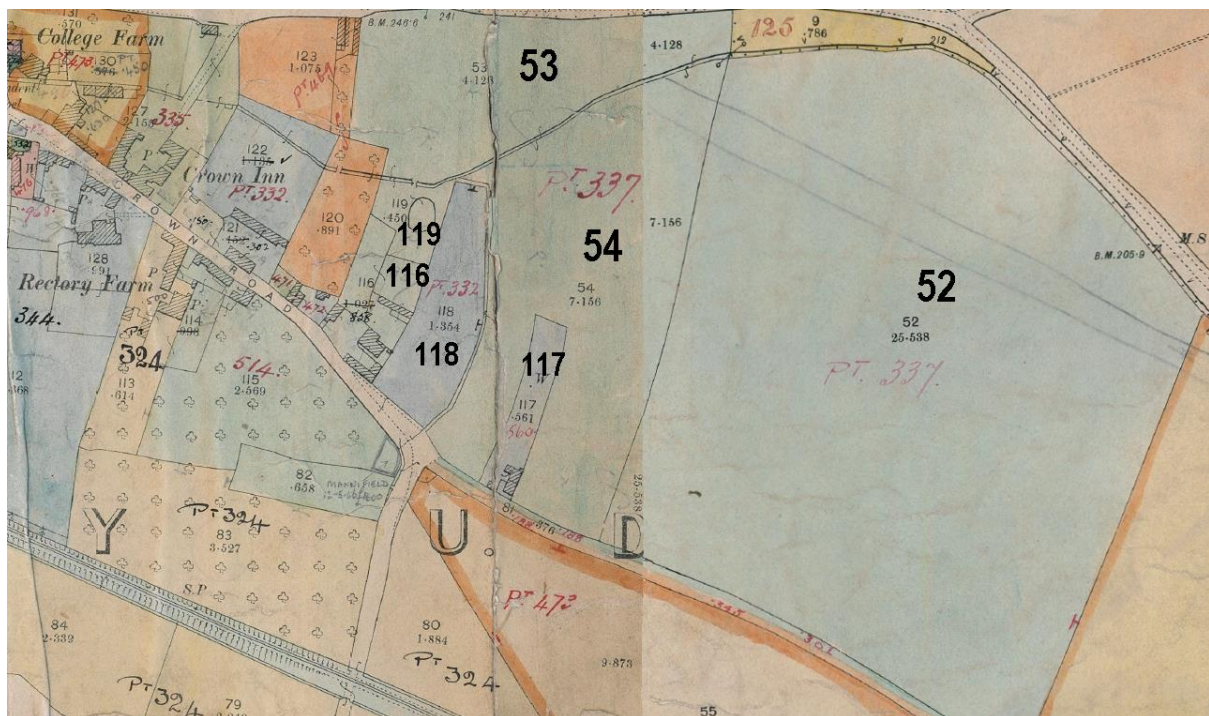
