 - 3-John Hussey Cooper b. 1869, Lime burner. Wheatley baptised 4/08/1869 m. Henrietta. In 1911 he was living at Taunton House (also known as 'The Racks'). Date of death not known. 4-Phyllis Henrietta May Cooper b. 1897, baptised 5 Sept 1897
 - 3-Elizabeth Emily Cooper b. 1870. married Arthur Welch (solicitor) 5 June 1901, was living in 17 Parkhill first named The Turrets and then the Gables by 1911. This address was used by Edward Montague (Hussey) Cooper who was in the Royal Navy when he was away from home. Died in Southsea 1929
 - 3-<u>James Wilson Cooper</u> b. 1872, Wheatley, baptised 28/02/1872, m. Abigail, d. 1958. In 1911 Brickworks manager living with his widowed mother Mary Jane at The Lodge, 25 Parkhill,
 - 3-Edward Montague Cooper b. 1873, Wheatley. Recorded at the school in1877. Service record on file shows that he was in the Royal Navy from the early 1900s and probably met his wife, Violet Coghill (b. 1878 in New South Wales, Australia, died in 1965) while on board HMS Australia in Sydney in 1903. m 22 July 1904 Not living in Wheatley in 1911. Died 1953 in Armidale, NSW, Australia.
 - 3-<u>Joseph Hussey Cooper (4)</u> b. 1875, Wheatley, in 1911 traction engine driver at brickworks living with his widowed mother Mary Jane at The Lodge, 25 Parkhill. Died 1931 in Oxford Mental Hospital, which might explain why he appears not to have been a manager.

 - 3-Laura Martha Cooper b. 1885, d. 25 Dec 1886
 - 3-Ivy Gwendoline Cooper b. 1888, d 1981, m. William Hippesley 1913, d. October 1914 in WW1.
 - 3-<u>Hubert Dudley Cooper</u> (added to genealogical archive). B. 1886, d. 1968. in 1911 Brickworks manager living with his widowed mother Mary Jane at The Lodge, 25 Parkhill
