1864 VENDOR - James Robbins

PURCHASER - M Davis (M Tombs', widow)

4 Cottages (now numbered 29,31,33,35) built by James' father, Edward Robbins,  
in Middle Road or Street (now Church Road)

TENNANTS were William Parker

*George Marlow Mary Austin*

John Staymaker (?Slaymaker)

1888 VENDOR - M Davis (formerly M Tombs, widow)

PURCHASER - William Berkely *Gardner* of Dorchester in the County of Oxon. -  
*Grocer*

4 Cottages (now numbered 29,31,33,35) and a cottage in Bell bane

1895 William Berkely *Gardner* died. His daughter, Elizabeth Chapman inherited.

1924 Elizabeth died. Her daughter, Laura Beatrice, wife of Marshall John Bell inherited

1932 VENDOR - Laura Beatrice Bell, of 71 Helix Road, Brixton Hill, London PURCHASER -

Arthur Samuel Sheldon, of Church Road, Wheatley 4 Cottages (now numbered  
29,31,33,35) built by Edward Robbins in Middle Road or Street (now Church Road)

TENANTS- Thomas Naish

1947 Arthur Samuel Sheldon, late of Applecroft, 90 Church Road, died October 18<sup>th</sup> 1947.

The Will was proved, but the administration was not completed by the death of his  
son, Kenneth Arthur James, in 1959 (aged 41), nor even by the death of his widow,  
Constance Emily, in 1974 (aged 82)

1974 Frederick Arthur Naish, as beneficiary of Arthur Samuel Sheldon's will, became the  
owner of 35 Church Road

1981 Frederick Naish died, and number 35 was bought by Jane Edith Louisa Taylor of  
Ladder Hill, Wheatley
