FOR the first time since it was built on the Holton skyline, local residents were yesterday able to see the view from the 140-ft. tower of the Lady Spencer-Churchill College of Education when all the buildings were open to the public.

More than 2,000 guests were shown the modern teaching blocks and living quarters set round the nine-storey tower.

During the afternoon, students were showing visitors the special architectural features of the buildings while typical classes were in progress in the work and lecture rooms.

Before the main body of guests arrived, some former students spent the morning looking over the new buildings.

The Principal of the Teachers' Training College, Miss Dora Cohen, said invitations had been sent to the Wheatley and Holton parish councils, all the local churches and the local schools.
