Bonnie regretted the passing of the Wheatley Feast which he used to look forward to each year, and also the time when steam trains used to run on the line through Littleworth.

Acremead ran from the footpath on top of the railway tunnel down to the brook. The top part was known as Spine Copse Spinney and the bottom part was owned by Mr Fowler of Acremead House, and known as Fowler's Field.

He remembered Miss Dale who lived in The Old House in Westfield Road. She had a club foot and was well-known in the village. One wing of her house was used as a Roman Catholic chapel and, apparently, Keydale Road was named after Mr Jack Key (Headmaster) and Miss Dale.
