

1891 Wheatley Charities management 1903

Oxford Journal - Saturday 25 April and 25 July 1903

The Clerk wrote to the Vicar as to the charities. and the Vicar. in a letter, sent the following information:

(1) Common allotment, as regulated by a scheme of February 1879. By desire of former trustees he was nominated a trustee and duly appointed by the Charity Commissioners. He could not tell them anything about the deeds, but imagined they would be in the keeping of the Charity Commissioners

(2) Lady Curzon and Sims charity, regulated by a scheme of 1873. W. Ashhurst. Esq, of Waterstock, the trustee appointed by the Charity Commissioners, had been every year good enough to manage the apportionment of the money received, and he as Vicar, with one or both of the churchwardens had examined and audited the balance Sheet.

(3) The Town Meadow charity, regulated by a scheme of 1887, had been for many years kindly managed by Mr. Frampton, and he had always seen at the Easter vestry the accounts and audited them with others. In each of the three cases they could get more information from the Charity Commissioners. He had. the Vicar wrote, given up the custody of the award map.
