- 58, Ladbrookes - railway porter at Wheatley station
- 60, Goodlakes - railway porter at Wheatley station
- 62, Small shop - Baxes - general shop for clothing, materials, some crockery, glassware. Also ran a Taxi service A garage in Church Rd (now car park)
- Corner house - Morris

BELL LANE

- 64, Chillingworth House, Trinders - Farmer - Ladder Hill
- Munt's woodyard
- Vale Brook House, Ropers (later Col Hall)
- White - Butchers - 4 sons - Reg (Pressed steel), Ron (Cardener), ? (RAF) and Victor (Butcher in Oxford covered market)
- Beasleys family

- 86, Mott House, W. Cox and family - railway signalman - 2 sons both with CWR - Ron- (stationmaster at Cowley) and Ken (office manager at Carfax Office, Oxford)
- 88, Johnsons - small holdings
- 90, Chapmans - builder/undertaker
- 94, Roberts House (sister of Averys - station sawmill)
- 98, Kings Cottage, Mrs Trinder/Mrs Palmer
- 100, Cromwell House - Brazil/Pratts
- URC - Congregational chapel - Rev Fry, then Rev Ives

NORTH SIDE

- Rays - house back from road

SMALL ALLEY

- Dungeys shop - very general store - originally 2 brothers then just one. Sold everything you ever wanted. So crowded with stock you could hardly get into shop.
- Builder's yard
- 21, Bossoms house
- The Old Parsonage, Brazzills
- West end of George, Clements
- Whites - milkman
- Deeds
- Hydes - baker A shop - family run, bread, cakes etc
- 41, Surmans
- 43, Horwoods
- 45, Bradburys - later converted to shop
- Waldes - shop - sold ice-cream, small cafe & general items of household goods. Taxi service continued by a son later on.

HOLLOWAY ROAD

- 47, Gosticks - shop - Ray Gostick was son of original owners of Gosticks Stores, lost his life in motor cycle road accident
- Wheelers - Gosticks manager
- Munts - postman
- King & Queen public house - Bernard Perkins
- Fred Naish - cycle repairer - lived in Church Road with his sister next to school. Charged up wireless accumulators, sold second hand bikes when

available

- 97, Harris' shop - grocers, hardware, fabrics, silks, cottons etc, paraffin oil for lamps and cookers

- 101, Gomers - 2 sisters
- 103, Stokes - baker at Dodds in Church Rd
- 105, Life's - Rita - school teacher
- 107, Post Office - Mrs Slatter - normal counter service for letters, parcels, payouts & telegrams. 4 postman making 2 deliveries daily to Wheatley, Holton, Waterperry Horspath
- 109, Garage - Huxter carriers - original parcel carriers
- Huxter/Hintons - Hinton was foreman with S.E.B.
