

16. HUNDRED COURT ROLL, 1595-1611

MS. Rolls Oxon. 117. Summary of parts of Bullington Hundred Roll containing View of Frankpledge, 1595-1611.

9 Oct. 1595. Presentments that the gates towards Whately Bridge and Ladder Hill are not made at the end of the town. William Bennet has an undertenant. The road is damaged by the overflow from private pumps.

10 Dec. 1598. The stream at Westgate needs cleaning. Ralph Cobbat has built 2 cottages against the statute. William Bennett and Walter Parsons have undertenants. The pound is to be repaired. Thomas Ardington built a cottage on his shop and did not adjoin lands as ordered by statute. Robert Gadburie sold ale and victuals without licence. William Francklin is elected tithing man and Bartholomew Beake hayward of Whately.

30 Apr. 1598. The stream is to be cleaned and unlawful games suppressed.

13 Oct. 1608. Unlawful games, undertenants and building of new cottages forbidden.

6 Oct. 1609. Richard Cox constable *vice* William Clarke, William Kerbie hayward and Richard Price tithing man *vice* Thomas Daie.

4 Oct. 1610. Illoyal games. William Callis's unlicensed ale. Thomas Daye throws rubbish in the stream.

27 March 1611. Thomas Whyte to keep stream by le Twigyard clear and others elsewhere.
